1. INTRODUCTION

The Somali universities graduates' survey is annual study conducted by Iftin Foundation which is national registered organization works education services and career development based in Mogadishu. The study is the fifth one of its type has conducted and published by Iftin Foundation to education partners and stakeholders for data of the students graduated from the country's universities and also from the secondary schools in Somalia.

This study provides realistic facts about the circumstances of the student graduates, in respect with their number, what they have studied and the locations of the universities they have graduated from.

This data facilitates as could be easily determined how it matches the job opportunities in the county and the number of student graduating from higher education institutions those basically considering are job seekers going to join labor market.

This data collection has been continuing from late of 2020 to early of 2021 and this data has been collected from up to 52 universities in the cities of Mogadishu, Putland, Galmudug, Hirshabelle, Southwest and Jubaland states of Somalia.

The survey indicated the number of student graduating from the country's universities in 2020 were reached 17,548 students, where in 2019 the number of student graduates were 15,927 students.

2. THE DATA PRESENTED IN THE SURVEY

To grasp complete comprehensive report on graduates data in Somalia, the study is focused on the number of graduates from higher institutes in Somalia, the faculties which students have graduated, the gender of graduates, the names of universities they have graduated from, and the areas of specialization they have studied.

2.1 The Faculties and the Graduate Students

In this study, Iftin Foundation has presented the students graduated from each faculty, has assembled the faculties on the bases of their similarities, though the universities studied had slight have some differences; naming some of the faculties; the study has attempted to integrate those faculties together and name the faculties unified in order to make the data collective.

The data shows the four faculties which most of the students had graduated from, and are as follows:-

The data shows the four faculties most of the students had graduated from, and are as follows:-

- **1. Faculty of Business Administration** (Accounting, Human Resources, Banking and Finance) has 2,644 which is 15.10% out of the total.
- **2. Faculty of Public Administration** has 2,571 which is 14.65% out of the total.
- **3.** Faculty of Nursing and Midwifery has 2,270 student graduates which is 12.94% out of the total.
- **4. Faculty of Computer Science/IT** had 1,772 graduates which is 10.10% out of the total.

Whereas the four faculties with the least of student graduates were as the following:

- 1. Faculty of Dentistry with only 4 graduates which is 0.02% out of the total.
- 2. Faculty of Pharmacology with 14 graduates which is 0.08% out of the total.
- **3. Journalism,** with 17 graduates which is 0.10% out of the total.
- **4. Faculty of Statistic and Planning** with 27 student graduates which is 0.15% out of the total.

2.2 The number of Male and Female

The study has also looked into the overall total of female and male graduated from the universities and how they were divided at each faculty.

In general, the number of students graduated from the country's universities in the year 2020 were 17,548 students, while the number of female were 5,352 which is 30.5%, out of the total, where the number of male were 12,196 which is 69.5% out of the total.

Most of the Female have graduated from the following four faculties:-

- 1. Public Health (884 female)
- 2. Business Administration (775 female)
- 3. Medical Laboratory (727 female)
- 4. Nursing & Midwifery (691 female)

The Least Female have graduated from the following four faculties:-


- 1. Dentistry (0)


4. CONCLUSION
